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CompactGTL's Brazilian project to start up in July, while GTL.F1 celebrates BTL project win in France

A pilot project for a gas-to-liquids (GTL) technology that would solve the challenge of what to do with unwanted associated natural gas during development of small oil fields will start up in July/August, said lain Baxter, general manager of CompactGTL, the company that developed the technology. Meanwhile, GTL.F1 – a joint venture of PetroSA, Statoil and Lurgi – has won a contract to develop a biomass-to-liquids (BTL) project in France, says the company's managing director, Matthias Wagner. Both companies made their announcements at this week's XTL* conference in London.
