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FEATURE: Groningen's decline – The risks and the alternatives

Groningen, the crown jewel of the Dutch gas industry and for decades Europe's lifeline during peak demand periods, has turned pariah for local residents affected by its production-related earthquakes. Despite repeated government measures to reduce the low-calorific gas field's annual quotas – from an unchecked 54 Bcm of production in 2013 to 42.5 Bcm in 2014, 27 Bcm in 2015 and 24 Bcm in 2016 – public discontent remains unabated.



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
