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South of the border: Mexico LNG route for US gas targets Asia, raises bottleneck risk

Mexico's gas output has declined significantly over the past decade. Unable to meet its steadily growing consumption, it has become the world's second-largest net importer of gas via pipeline, with volumes sourced from the US.
